Stassi, 36, briefly studied interior design as an undergrad at Ole Miss (she began rearranging her family's furniture at age 10), but when her business took off after decorating for friends, she credited a higher source. "It was a gift from God," she says. "Some people can sing, some people can dance—I can decorate." Stassi studied the work of Gerrie Bremermann, an acclaimed decorator in her native New Orleans, to learn how to combine modern pieces and antiques, and names Vicente Wolf, John Saladino and Kelly Wearstler as important role models for her livable minimalism, which is invigorated by pops of gutsy color.
